DID YOU KNOW?

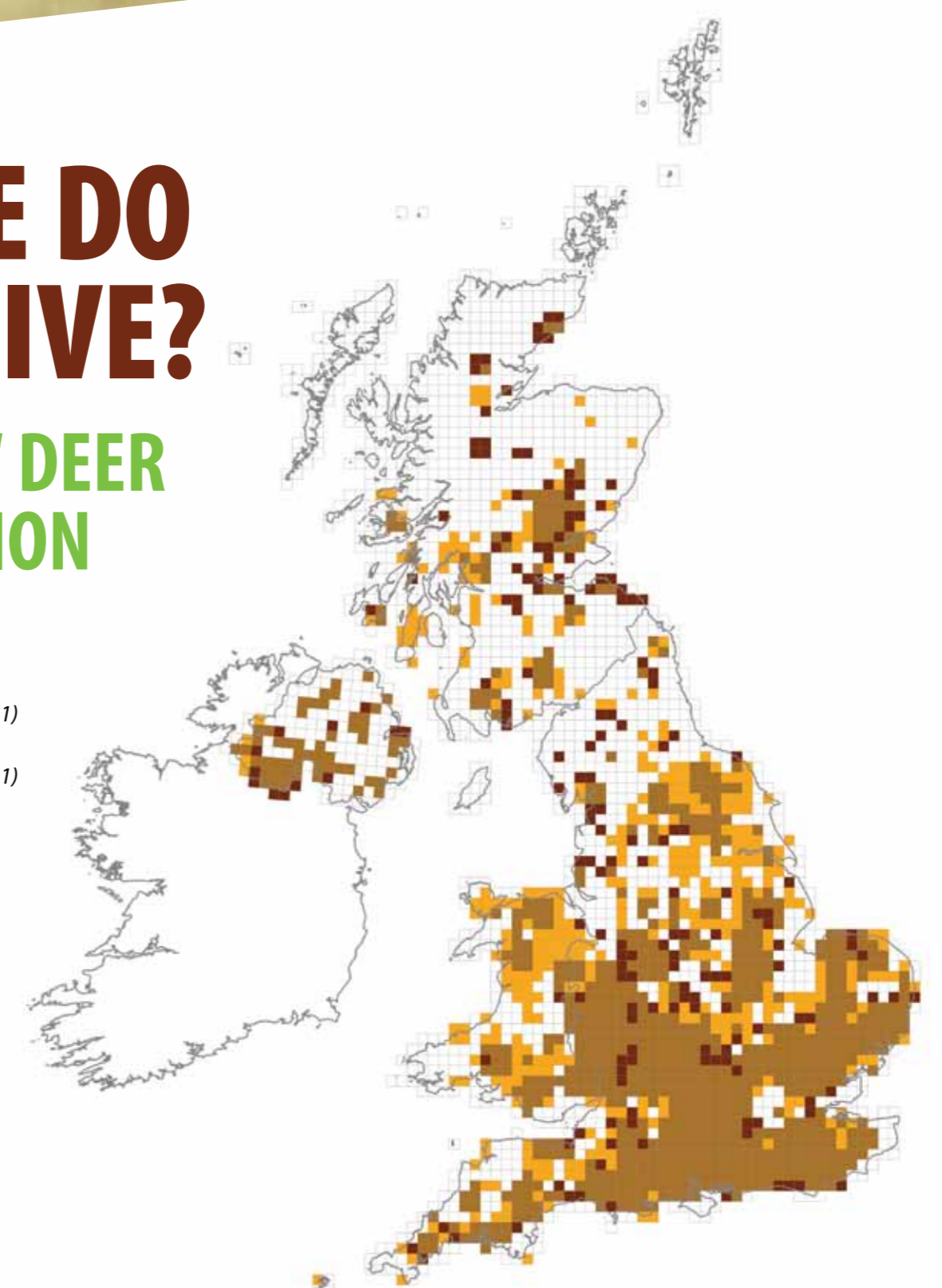
FALLOW DEER:

- are not truly native to the UK, with most introductions from the 11th century onwards
- have four main colour variations: tan with white spotting which darkens and loses the spots in winter, a paler tan which retains its spots, almost black, and white
- male fallow are the only deer in the UK which regularly grow obvious palmate antlers
- can form large herds which are capable of causing significant agricultural or environmental damage
